- 30. Camden Art Center: Located in London, they produce exhibitions, which used

33. African National Congress, Canadian Branch: (Ontario) Dumile made several calendars and posters for them. Contact Joe Solajee (sp?)

- 34. UN Center Against Apartheid: Contact Abdennour Abraus, Deputy to the Director,

 UNETPSA, Chief of Branch, UN Centre Against Apartheid,

 UN, NY,NY,10017 (212-754-6674). Dumile made posters

 for them.
- International U.N. Emergency Fund: (Geneva) Dumile made posters and cards for them between 1976-78, to raise money for children who had run away during the 1976 riots.
- 36. Goodman Gallery: Managed by Linda Goodman, this gallery is located in Johannesburg. She has and has sold many of Dumile's drawings, water colors, clay sculptures. She may know the whereabouts of a well known piece he did (bronze) of Luthuli. (A story and picture of the piece appeared in the "South African Pretoria News" in March of 1967 or 1968.) Dumile sometimes used other names (S. Maphiri, Mslaba, Mxgaji) during this period because of controversy surrounding his work.

37. Dennis Duerden: African Art writer who now resides in Los Angeles and works as a film producer; he may own one or two of Dumile's drawings.

- 38. Bernard Fagg: African Art writer who has mentioned Dumile in some of his published work.
- 39. Oulli Beier (sp?): African Art writer who has mentioned Dumile some of his published work.
- 40. David Newell: New York Times writer/reporter (754-6155) He wrote a story about Dumile in connection with his recent UN show. Before he could get it finished and into print, he was reassigned to handle Grenada and Lebonon crises. He was contacted and said he will do the best he can to get it published as soon as possible.
